Baking Hack-2024 Ingredient-SODA POP.





First place books from each county advance to District in three age divisions. Juniors, Intermediates & Seniors. The 1st place senior record book in each category will have the opportunity to advance to State level.

- State Record Book Winner Trip: 1st place winners will earn the opportunity to attend the Texas 4-H Leadership Conference in Washington, D.C. during Thanksgiving break.

Questions on each class will be emphasized throughout the camp, but there will be NO ORAL REASONS. Campers will have the opportunity to compete in a contest at the end of camp.

Each camper is required to have a chaperone attend with them. This can be a parent, coach, or teacher. The chaperones will go through all live classes, and have breakout sessions for coaching strategy and roundtable discussions.
